Weeks 14-18: Game scenarios

Weeks 19-20: Controlled scrimmage (stopping the play to point out where players should be positioned)

Weeks 21-23: Team play, tactics and strategy

Do I need to know how to skate? Basic skating skills are required. It is recommended that a player with no prior skating experience take a class through Skatetown's Learn to Skate program before enrolling in this class.



Want to play hockey but don't know how?

What equipment will I need for the class? Players are required to wear full gear. Loaner helmet and rental skates are included in the price of the program. Skatetown's Pro-shop has put together a special package price that includes all the equipment you will need. Stop by our Pro-Shop for more information. A Skatetown Jersey will be included and must be picked up the first day of class.

What if I miss a class? If a Player cannot make a class, the player is responsible for the material covered in that class. You may get the class curriculum from the instructor and attend a stick time or public session for extra practice, or schedule a private lesson with your instructor to get caught up.

Who coaches the class? Jeff Eastburn is our highly sought after Adult Learn to Play Hockey coach and has been involved with Skatetown since its doors opened in December 1997. Jeff will be joined by several other assistant coaches on the ice to make sure you get enough specialized attention when going through the class
